SCHOOL UNIFORM

Everyday Uniform

Due to the difficulties so many of our students have had with attending educational settings in the past, and school uniform often presenting a huge additional barrier, we do not have a uniform policy in place at Hartmore Genesis. We have, however, worked with the students to develop a "Dress code" and we ask that students follow these guidelines to ensure their clothing is appropriate for school.

We ask that students wear:

- Dark coloured trousers or jeans.
- T-shirt or long-sleeve top, full length (no crop tops or spaghetti-strap tops).
- · Knee length skirts or shorts.
- · Dark coloured trainers or shoes.

We ask for students to avoid the following items:

- Ripped jeans or trousers.
- Clothing items that allow midriff to show.
- Low cut tops.
- Hooded tops
- Large logos on sweatshirts/jumpers/joggers.
- Heeled shoes or sandals/flip-flops.

Physical Education & Outdoor Education Uniform

On days when students have PE or Outdoor Education, we ask that they wear appropriate clothing for their activities.

Students can wear dark coloured jogging bottoms or knee-length shorts with trainers and a t-shirt/long-sleeve top. We ask that students bring appropriate clothing for the weather, this might include a cap in the summer and a coat or waterproof jacket in the winter.

Equipment & Water Bottles

No specific equipment is required to be brought into school. The school will provide all stationary and learning equipment for your child, in addition they will also provide a water bottle.

COMMUNICATION

Communication

When joining our school, we ask for a contact form to be completed. This includes an email address and mobile phone number, allowing us to send letters, newsletters and other communications.

Consultation Evenings

Consultation evenings are held twice a year – during Term 2 and Term 4 – for parents and carers to meet with the class teacher, look at work and discuss progress. These are run by appointment and will be organised by the teacher. We also have an annual school open day and summer BBQ, providing another opportunity look at the work of their child throughout the year, meet with class teachers and discuss your child's progress.

Daily Handovers

As part of our communication procedures you'll receive a daily handover for your child. This will include a brief description of their day and any significant information we need to pass on. We also kindly request that parents and/or carers update the school with any signification information that could impact a child's day.

Attendance and Punctuality

It is our aim for every child to be in school every day. Of course, we know that this isn't always possible, so we set out some guidance on keeping school informed of absence. This helps us check that all children are safe.

Term Dates

Dates for academic terms are published on the school website at least 6 months before the start of each academic year. You can also view this <u>here</u>.

Food and Drink

We encourage children to eat healthy snacks. This might be a piece of fruit, a snack of vegetables, or a savoury item such as cheese, breadsticks or crackers. We do not allow sweets or chocolate as a break and or lunch time snack.

Lunch boxes must be clearly marked with the owner's name. Fizzy drinks, glass bottles, breakable flasks and cans are not allowed.

Due to the increasing number of children with severe allergies, nuts and seeds are not to be brought into school. We are a nut and seed-free school.

Illness

If your child is too ill to attend school, please contact the school on the first and each subsequent day of absence on the school absence line before 8.45am.

You can do this by telephoning 01452 700942.


If you child is suffering with diarrhoea and or vomiting, please allow 48 hours after this has ceased before returning your child to school.

Medical Appointments

We ask that if possible you make routine appointments outside of school hours. If this is not possible or it is a hospital appointment, please send in the appointment letter or card to the school office so we can make a copy and approve the absence.

Holidays

Schools are not permitted to authorise holidays except in exceptional circumstances. If there are exceptional reasons why you would like to take your children out of school during term time, please request a notification of absence form from the school office.



Behaviour

We believe children are behaving in the moment the only way they can. We do not believe that children think of themselves as being deliberately difficult.

If we can meet a child's needs successfully, they will not become upset. If children are happy they are much less likely to present with behaviours. When children do get upset they are met with kindness and often supported so discreetly that it does not really disturb the rest of the children.
